The Joint Health and Safety Committee wish you and yours a very Merry Christmas and ask that you continue to drive safe out on the road each day. With winter weather arriving we wanted to remind you that the leading cause of death during winter storms is transportation accidents. Winter is the most difficult driving season. Not only do you have snow and ice to deal with, but there are fewer hours of

daylight as well. Even experienced drivers can find their nerves and skills tested by winter road conditions.

- Keep your windows, mirrors and lights clear of snow and ice
- Always wear your seatbelt
- Be aware of potentially icy areas such as shady spots and bridges
- Slow down.

Excessive speed is a contributing factor in 20 percent of occupant

fatalities.

- Each year 25 percent of deaths and 40 percent of serious injuries from vehicle collisions occur at intersections. Be careful even when you have the right of way.

Winter Road Conditions Reports are made available during the winter months, from end of Oct to Apr each year by calling the **Provincial Call Centre: 1-800-268-4686**. Listen to the options. This is an automated service that will give information about provincially maintained highways.

No Paperwork-No Pay

Driver paperwork is very important. Without it we cannot pay you or invoice the customer. At a minimum when you are dispatched you will require a FCTR Timesheet, Driver Trip Report and in some cases a Log sheet. At the end of your shift turn in to the customer their bills of lading, a copy of your timesheet, your driver trip report and your log sheet.

Braking before turning

A skid often develops while braking for a curve or turn. Do your braking well before the turn. Remember to keep all wheels rolling during your turn. A skidding wheel will cause a loss of control. Brakes on an empty vehicle still have all the power necessary for a full load. When your truck is empty, it is very easy to over brake. Use extra caution when braking on slippery roads. **Adjust your speed before you get into trouble.**

Communication is the key. Keep us informed of your availability, any address changes, phone # changes etc. Our goal here at FCTR/SSG is to find meaningful employment for you the driver. We cannot employ you if we cannot contact you. Keep in touch. Seasons greetings to one and all.
